Richard Maxwell Hal was born October 2, 1916 in Highgate, Ontario. His nickname was "Scottie". He had two sisters and his father was a veteran of the Great War. Maxwell lived on Colborne Street. He attended Colborne Street School, and later, Strathroy Collegiate Institute.

He was married to Pearl Elson. He enjoyed playing different types of sports including baseball and hockey.

He was a member of the Middlesex Light infantry from 1930 to 1940. He enlisted with the Kent Regiment and he served overseas as a private. He is buried at the Strathroy Cemetery.

With more than five years service in the army during World War II, he was a corporal. He received the King's Award while serving in the Italian campaign. His father was killed in action during the First World War.
