

Name: Wyatt, Charles Joshua

Rank: Flight Lt

Charles Joshua Wyatt had come to Mount Brydges and worked in the Union Bank before he was killed in action as part of No. 2 Squadron, No.1 Wing Royal Naval Air Service. He entered aviation school in the autumn of 1915 at Toronto Ontario and went overseas in December of that year. On 21st August 1917 when returning from a mission, he and his observer were killed when their aeroplane fell 150 feet to the ground. He is buried at Dunkirk Town Cemetery, France.

MT. BRYDGES.

Word has been received here of the death in Flanders of Lieut. Charles Wyatt. Lieut. Wyatt was 24 years of age and came from London, Eng. to Mount Brydges, about 10 years ago. He was a general favorite. He entered the aviation school at Toronto early in the autumn of 1915, went overseas in December of that year, and later went to France, where he was attached to No. 2 squadron, No. 1 wing, R. N. A. S. He was considered one of the best flyers in the squadron. He was returning from a scouting tour on August 21 when something went wrong, and he and his observer were dashed 150 feet to the ground, both being killed instantly. His O. C. says: "He was the staunchest of escorts, and the most determined and plucky pilot and universally beloved by both officers and men." Before enlisting Lieut. Wyatt was on the staff of the Union Bank in Mount Brydges.
