38 year old Dougald McNeill attested in the Army Medical Corps at London Ontario. He had worked as a shipper. On the 2 Sept 1918 he suffered a compound fracture of his left femur due to a gun shot wound. He was invalided to Canada on the 10 June 1919 and was Struck off Strength to the Western Ontario Medical Hospital at London. He died of septicemia 25 August 1919. He is buried at Longwood cemetery near Melbourne Ontario.



The Court having assembled pursuant to order, proceed to
take the evidence of Medical Officers in charge of the
case.

Major H.C. Allison, C.A.M.C. having been duly sworn
states as follows.

I assisted Capt. A.B. Rankin in performing an
operation to remove dead bone from the left femur of
#529152 Pte. D. McNeil at the Western Ontario Military
hospital on August 11th, 1919.

Prior to the operation, the patient was in good
general condition with a discharging sinus in the left
which led from the femur. Previously he had had four
operations, two for the removal of dead bone. Following
the operation, there were no symptoms of general
Septicaemia for two days. The wound was clean.

I was the officer in charge of the Surgical ward
and visited the patient daily from the date of the
operation until his death. On August 13th he took a
chill, followed by a rise in temperature and
accompanied by vomiting, indicating that he had
developed Septic ~~maxillary~~ infection. The wound was
still clean rendering it impossible to definitely
locate the site of infection but Capt. Rankin who
saw the patient with me that day suggested that it
was a case of embolism probably located in the
abdomen. I was of the same opinion. He could only
be treated for this general condition, keeping his

heart toned up, bowels moving and stimulation. I tried to get Lt. Col. H.A. McCallum Consulting Physician of W.O.M.H. but he was out of town and did not see the patient until August 23rd. He was unable to locate the site of the infection or advise anything further with reference to treatment. The patient gradually became weaker and died on Aug. 25th. Before we could obtain permission from his people to perform a post-mortem, the undertaker had removed the body.

SECOND WITNESS,

Capt. A.B. Rankin C.A.M.C. having been duly sworn states as follows,-

I am the officer in charge of Surgery M.D. No.1. On Aug. 11th assisted by Major Allison, I performed an operation on #529152 Pte. D. McNeil at W.O.M.H. for the removal of dead bone from the femur.

There was a large amount of dead bone in the shaft of the femur lying in an infected cavity. This bone was all removed and the cavity cleaned out and packed with gauze. The incision made was about five and one-half inches in length. The conditions were due to a gun-shot wound in the femur which had caused a compound fracture and the bone had become infected. I should judge that there had already been several operations for the removal of dead bone. I

I saw the patient again two days later, after he had just had a chill followed by a rise of temperature to about 104 degrees with pulse around 140. He was vomiting but complained of no pain. An examination of the wound at the time showed it to be in excellent condition and there were no signs of any local acute infection. From these signs and symptoms, the diagnosis of embolism was made but we could not locate where it was. Major Allison and myself were agreed that general treatment for Septicaemia should be followed.

I saw the patient again on Saturday Aug. 23rd in company with Major Allison and at that time the site of the infection seemed to be in the abdomen. The patient was much weaker and no operative treatment was indicated. I did not see the patient again.

A. Patients showing these symptoms always die eventually.

1. The Court having heard the evidence, is of the opinion that No. 529152 Pte . D. McNeil, Late 47th Battalion, C.E.F., contracted Septicaemia following an operation for the removal of dead bone from the femur. Septicaemia was complicated by ^{an} embolism resulting in the death of the patient on August 25th, 1919.

2. The Court Finds,

(a) That the deceased received all proper and necessary Medical attention while a patient at the Western Ontario ^{Canter} ~~Milit~~ Military Hospital.

(b) There is no evidence of negligence on the part of Medical Officers, Nursing-Sisters or any member of the Staff of the Western Ontario Military Hospital.
