Summary: Edward T. Moore was a carpenter from London who attested in the 135th Btn 23 Nov 1915. He had

been a Sgt Major in the old 26th Middlesex Battalion. He was appointed Sgt in the 135th but reverted to the ranks to go overseas with the 18th Btn. He suffered trench fever. Promoted Sergeant, he was killed in action on the 4th of April 1918 in the trenches north of Neuville Vitasse. He is honoured on the Vimy Memorial.

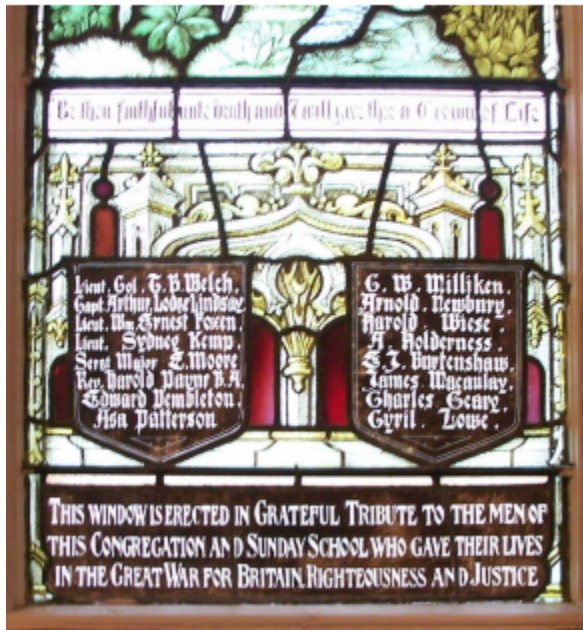

DECLARATION TO BE MADE BY MAN ON ATTESTATION.

I, Edward T. Moore, do solemnly declare that the above are answers made by me to the above questions and that they are true, and that I am willing to fulfil the engagements by me now made, and I hereby engage and agree to serve in the Canadian Over-Seas Expeditionary Force, and to be attached to any arm of the service therein, for the term of one year, or during the war now existing between Great Britain and Germany should that war last longer than one year, and for six months after the termination of that war provided His Majesty should so long require my services, or until legally discharged.

OATH TO BE TAKEN BY MAN ON ATTESTATION.

I, Edward T. Moore, do make Oath, that I will be faithful and bear true Allegiance to His Majesty King George the Fifth, His Heirs and Successors, and that I will as in duty bound honestly and faithfully defend His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Person, Crown and Dignity, against all enemies, and will observe and obey all orders of His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, and of all the Generals and Officers set over me. So help me God.

CERTIFICATE OF MAGISTRATE.
