Summary: Ross Dickenson Briscoe is another name on the cenotaph with no obvious connection to Strathroy. Having said that however, his parents lived in Galt Ontario and he was a bank clerk there. He was commissioned at Valcartier Quebec 1 Sept 1914 and was part of the original wave of Canadians to go overseas. He was accidentally shot on the ranges at Sling Plantation Camp in Wiltshire England on the 6th of Jan 1915. His grave is in the Bulford Church Cemetery in Wiltshire.
