James Cobban Forsyth On the 26th of Sept 1918, the Strathroy Age published the following notice:

Forsyth- Perished with Steamship Missanabia, torpedoed by German Submarine, on Sept 9, Captain James C. Forsyth (M. D.), of the Canadian Pay and Records Office, London, England; native of Caradoc Township and brother of Dr. M. F. Forsyth, of Strathroy

Dr Forsyth had practiced in the Yukon and British Columbia before the war. He was commissioned on the 30th Dec 1915 at Calgary Alberta, and arrived in England 10 April 1916. He was undergoing training when he was thrown from a horse on the 9 Jun 1918 breaking his left wrist which left him with traumatic osteoarthritis. He was returning to St Thomas Ontario on board the Missanabia, when it was torpedoed. His name is listed on the Soldiers Tower at the University of Toronto. His body was recovered and landed in Great Britain. He is buried at Milford Haven Cemetery, Pembrokeshire England.

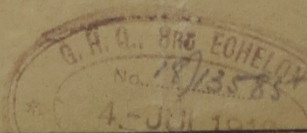

FORSYTH—Perished with Steamship Missanabia, torpedoed by German submarine, on Sept. 9, Captain James C. Forsyth (M.D.), of the Canadian Pay and Record Office, London, England; native of Caradoc Township, and brother of Dr. M. F. Forsyth, of Strathroy.

—The sad news was received here this week that Captain James C. Forsyth (M.D.), of the Canadian Pay and Record Office, London, England, brother of Dr. M. F. Forsyth, of Strathroy, had perished at sea, while returning to Canada on furlough with the intention of spending Christmas with his sisters in St. Thomas. Capt. Forsyth was a passenger on the Steamship Missanabia, which was reported torpedoed by a German submarine on Sept. 9, and died of wounds received in the explosion. His body was recovered and taken to England. Capt. Forsyth was a native of Caradoc Township, and practiced his profession for some five years in the Yukon and British Columbia. He enlisted for overseas service about three years ago. His death makes the first break in the family. He is survived by four brothers and four sisters, viz.: George A., in Alberta; William, of Superior, Wisconsin; David, of London, and Dr. M. F. Forsyth, of Strathroy; Mrs. R. A. Gardner, of Jackson, Mich.; Mrs. C. O. Gardner, of London, and Misses Elizabeth and Margaret Forsyth, of St. Thomas.
