

# Frederick William Jay



**Rank:** Captain

**Branch:** 1st Battalion

**War:** World War 1

**Year Served:** 1916

**Summary:** Jay Frederick William had served with the 26th Regiment before the war. He was a Strathroy Merchant and a promoter of athletics, member of the Board of Trade, a volunteer fireman and involved in fraternal and musical circles. He brought his commission to the 33rd Btn CEF in Oct 1915. After the 33rd was redistributed, he served in the 1st Btn. On the 9th of July 1916 he was killed in the trenches at Zillebeke during a heavy bombardment. He rests in Hoge Crater Cemetery in Belgium. A tribute service was held in Strathroy.
