Pte. G. M. Faulds. George Maitland Faulds was a 6' tall 175 lb married farmer from North Battleford Saskatchewan. He was born in Caradoc Township and had served with the 22nd Saskatchewan Light Horse. On the 24th July 1915, he attested in the 65th Btn and then was transferred to the 46th Btn at Bramshott England. He was killed in action on the 17th of Sept 1916. He is buried in Ridge Wood Military Cemetery West-Vlaanderen Belgium.

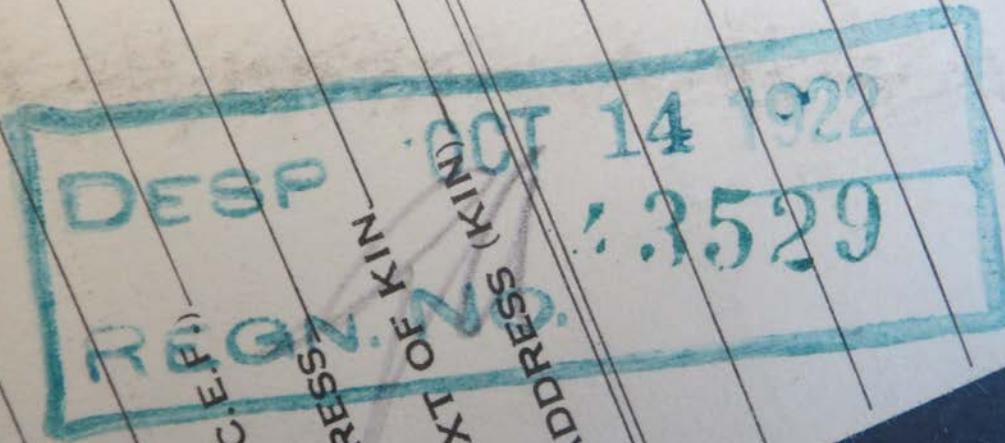

PTE. G. FAULDS KILLED.

Pte. George Maitland Faulds, officially reported killed in action, was the youngest of the five brothers of Mr. Edward Faulds, collector of statistics of the Department of Education, whose home is at 1 Aberdeen avenue. He enlisted in his home of Battleford, Sask., where he has been farming for the last few years, in August, 1915. He went overseas in June, and he has been in France only about a month.

He was born near London, Ont., 45 years ago. He was the only one of the family young enough to join the army. Most of his brothers are now in the London district. He leaves a widow in Battleford.

George M. Faulds Killed in France

Mrs. G. M. Faulds, city, received a telegram from the militia department, Ottawa, stating that her husband, Pte. G. M. Faulds of the 66th battalion had been killed in action in the trenches in France. Pte. Faulds left here with his regiment early in July. As soon as he reached Great Britain he was put on ambulance duty back of the fighting line. Later he was in the great Somme offensive. While in the front line trenches he met his death. He leaves a wife and three small children. They have the sympathy of the entire city and district in their hour of trial. Mrs. Faulds is a sister of Mr. M. A. Hoover, just outside the city, and Mr. D. L. Hoover, North Battleford.

A memorial service will be held in his old place of worship, the Baptist church, on Sunday at the hour of 2.30 p.m. The members of Saskawanna lodge T.O.O.F. of which the deceased was an active and popular member as well as at one time noble grand, will assemble in the lodge hall from where they will, in honor of their departed brother, march to the place of service. Rev. Mr. Beeching will conduct the service at the church.
